The Irish Newspaper Archives is one of our most popular on-

line resources and it's easy to see why! With over 110 newspaper titles (including local, national and out of print titles), this archive spans over 280 years of history. Popular titles such as the Kilkenny People, the Irish Independent, the Munster Times and the Wexford People can be found in a digitised, searchable format making your quest for information easier than ever.

Library members can access this archive for free by logging onto the WiFi or a PC in any Kilkenny Library branch. Once you've found what you're looking for, you can even save to a memory stick, print or send to your family or friends.

Newspapers on Microfilm

If you're more of a traditionalist, we also have titles including the Leinster Journal, the Kilkenny People and the Kilkenny Moderator available to view

on our microfilm machines. You can make yourself comfortable in our Local Studies room in John's Green House and scroll through the papers at your leisure.

How many are there, where are they and what state are they in? You can help answer these questions by becoming part of a worldwide, sustainable project to record them on OpenStreetMap and Wikimedia. In this workshop, you will learn how to record photographs and local history on Wikimedia and how to map milk churn stands on OpenStreet- Map. Both are OpenData platforms which means that the data is acces- sible for anyone to use and work with. You can use the skills you acquire in the workshop to record any type of built heritage, including holy wells, mass paths, forges and many more.
